Report on Monday 20th October

Guest Speaker Summary – Rebecca Culver – Just Zilch

- **Summary of Talk – Rebecca Culver, Managing Director, Just Zilch**
- Rebecca began by explaining that Just Zilch is a **food rescue organisation** — it collects surplus or unsellable food from suppliers and redistributes it **free to anyone in need**. When the initiative started in 2011, the concept of food rescue was new and often misunderstood, but today it's widely recognised for its environmental and social impact.
- She highlighted the **scale of food waste**, noting that an average household throws away the equivalent of **three supermarket bags of food each year**, and nationally about **a third of all food produced** is wasted. Examples included rejected export orders or slightly blemished products — such as 20 pallets of onions or tins with minor rust — which would otherwise go to landfill

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- Just Zilch currently **rescues and redistributes 10–15 tonnes of food each week**, preventing waste and supporting a growing number of people. The organisation operates on a **no-judgement policy** — anyone can access food, as everyone faces hardship at times. Pride can be a barrier, but Rebecca encouraged people to view Just Zilch as a community resource rather than charity.
 - Demand has risen sharply: last year they served around **340 people a day**, now averaging **480 daily**, with peaks of up to **600 on Sundays**. To manage space and efficiency, food is pre-sorted into trays so people can still **choose what they want** without entering the full warehouse area.
 - She stressed that **food insecurity affects all walks of life** — business owners, families, and individuals — especially as costs rise. Addressing basics like food and shelter helps strengthen the wider community.
 - Financially, Just Zilch operates with minimal government funding, relying instead on **corporate partners, small regular donors, and the ‘Piece of Cake’ programme**, where individuals or businesses can contribute weekly or monthly.
 - Rebecca also mentioned special initiatives, such as a **Wednesday “Gold Card” session** for seniors, offering a quieter time to collect food.
 - She closed by acknowledging the ongoing challenges of space, funding, and demand, but celebrated how Just Zilch continues to grow — reducing waste, feeding people, and building a more caring community.
