# Report on meeting Monday 15 September

Awapuni member **Rodney Wong** spoke about the art and tradition of roasting a whole pig and how this practice connects Chinese heritage, community, and media representation. It was also a story about the challenges facing Asian movie making in New Zealand.



## Personal Story & TV Series

- In 2022, Rodney and his daughter Jessica created a six-part TV series, Sik Fan Heung (Let's Eat), funded with \$450,000 from NZ On Air.
- One episode featured roasting a whole pig in Palmerston North, documenting the process for the first time in a published cookbook.

#### Cultural & Historical Roots

- Roasting pigs is a long-standing Chinese tradition, though recipes were never formally written down.
- Chinese earth ovens ("pig ovens") were once common in Australia and New Zealand, especially in Chinese market gardens during the gold rush era.
- Today, few ovens remain accessible due to land use changes and health/safety issues.



## • Community & Leadership

- Rodney used pig roasting as part of leadership programs for young Chinese in New Zealand, teaching cultural traditions while building community.
- He shared a story of turning a family pig roast into a fundraiser for the Christchurch Choir, raising \$5,000.

## Practical Challenges & Adaptation

 Roasting a whole pig is labour-intensive, so they developed a method using pork bellies on custom frames, which allows for up to 20kg of meat and is easier to manage.



 Modern gas or electric pig roasters exist but lack the flavour and communal experience of traditional methods.

## • Equity in Media Representation

- Rodney highlighted underrepresentation of Asians in New Zealand's screen industry.
- In 2018, he co-founded the Pan-Asian Screen Collective to advocate for equity and build capability.



 Since then, representation has grown significantly, with alumni working internationally (e.g., Netflix's 3 Body Problem, Angelina Jolie film projects).

## • Linking Culture & Media

- The TV series on pig roasting was both a cultural preservation project and part of building Asian visibility in New Zealand media.
- What began as documenting a tradition became a platform for equity, storytelling, and celebrating Chinese heritage in Aotearoa.
